



Small Steps, School for Parents helps parents to help their own children who have cerebral palsy or other forms of motor and sensory impairment

How does Small Steps work?

Children attend a group session at Small Steps once per week with a parent or carer. There are up to 5 children per group who are all working on similar skills.

A team of teachers, conductors and physiotherapists lead the parent/ child team through a structured programme designed to help each child achieve the next developmental steps.

The approach is based on principles of conductive education and is holistic. The programme primarily focuses on learning new physical skills, but also encompasses:

- social skills
- communication skills
- sensory skills

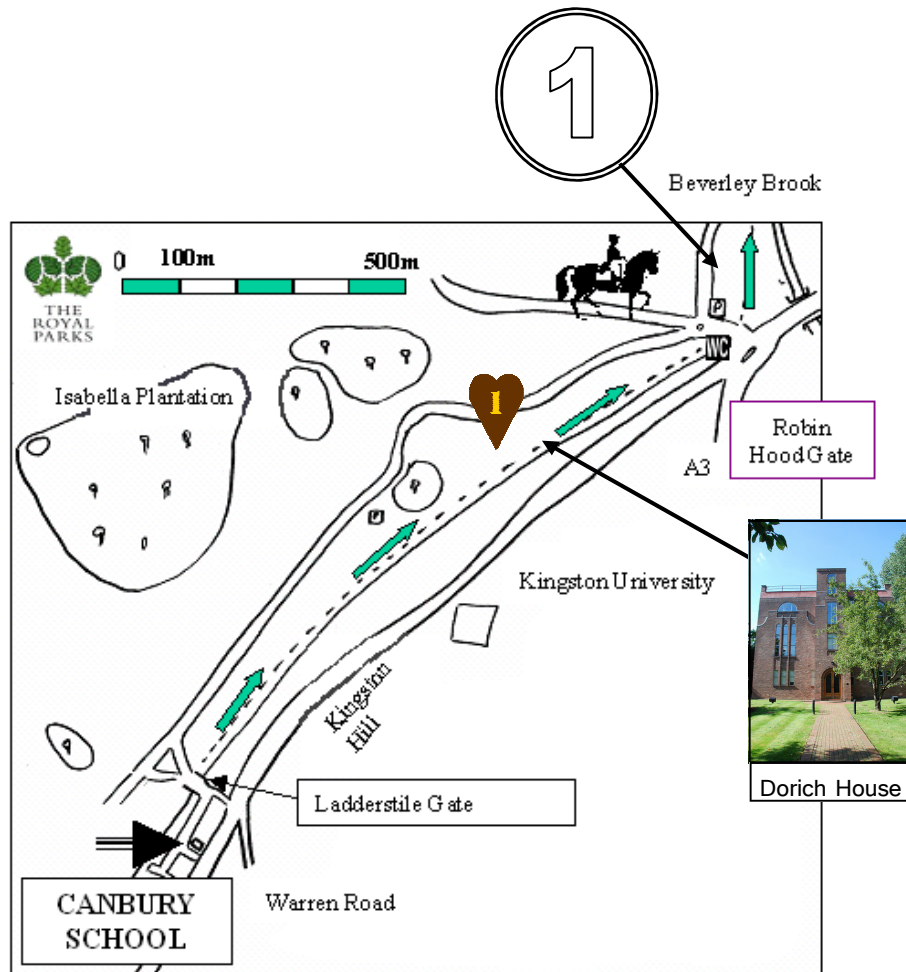

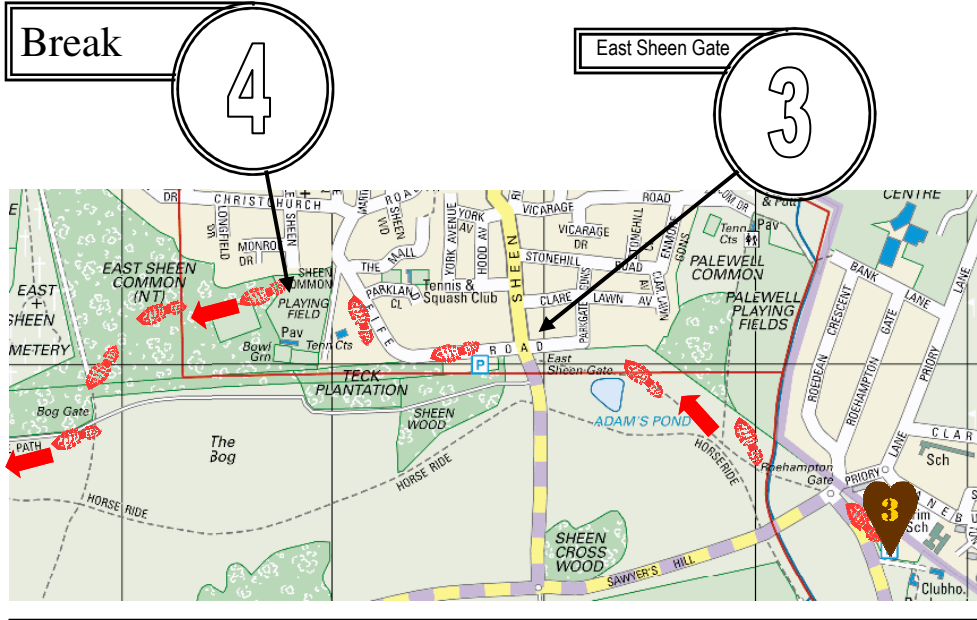
SECOND STAGE ROBIN HOOD GATE TO ADAMS POND

In 2005 Canbury's Charity was "Born Too Soon." The total raised was £2,233.26.

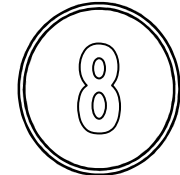
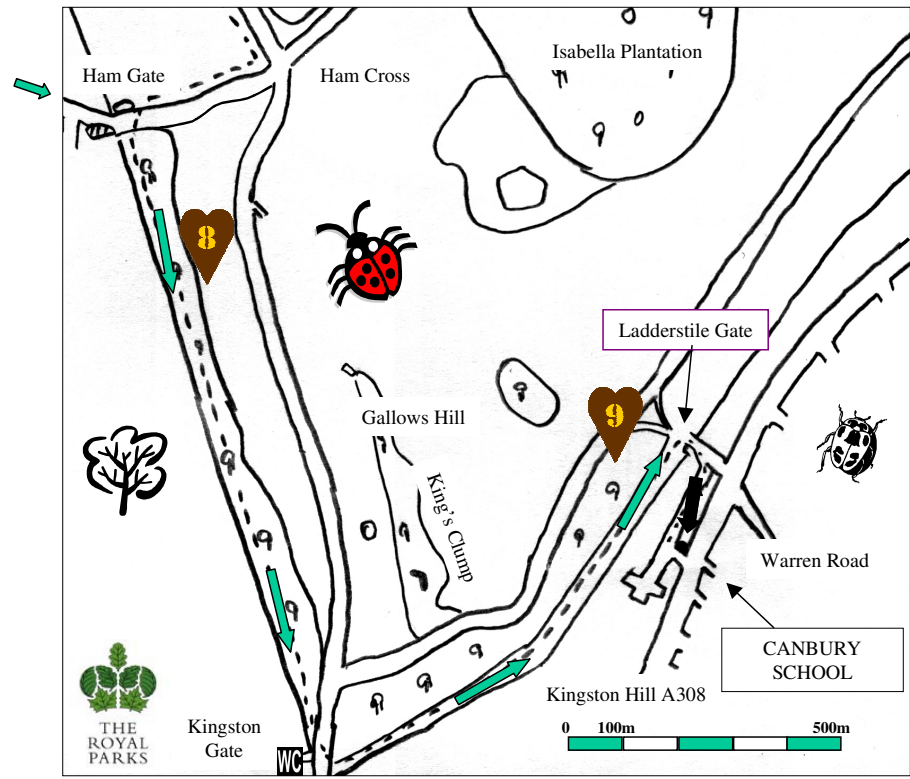
2006 the charity was Warren Park Canbury raised £1900.

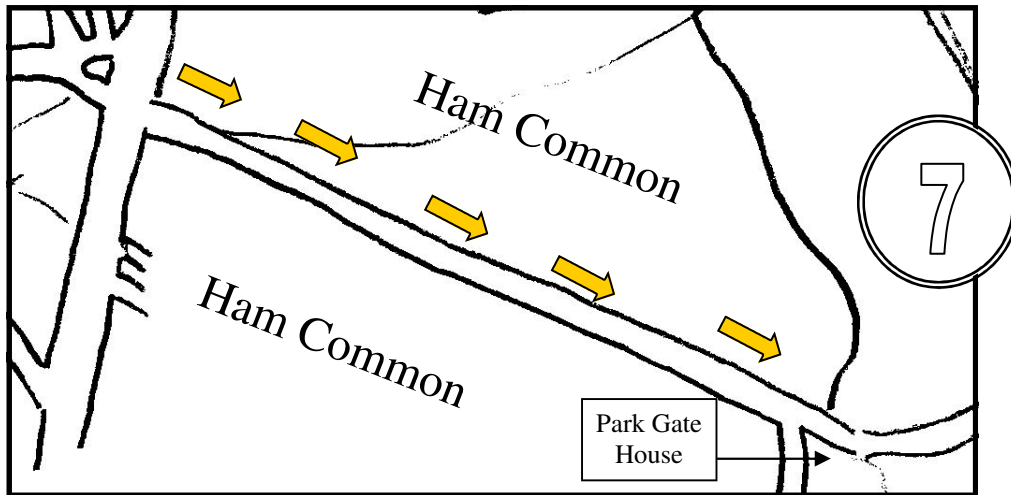

Small Steps

School for Parents helps children with special needs, aged from birth to 4 years, work on all areas of their development, using the principles of conductive education. These children have cerebral palsy, other forms of motor impairment, syndromes or sensory impairment. They need a great deal of extra stimulation and assistance to help them reach even the most basic milestones

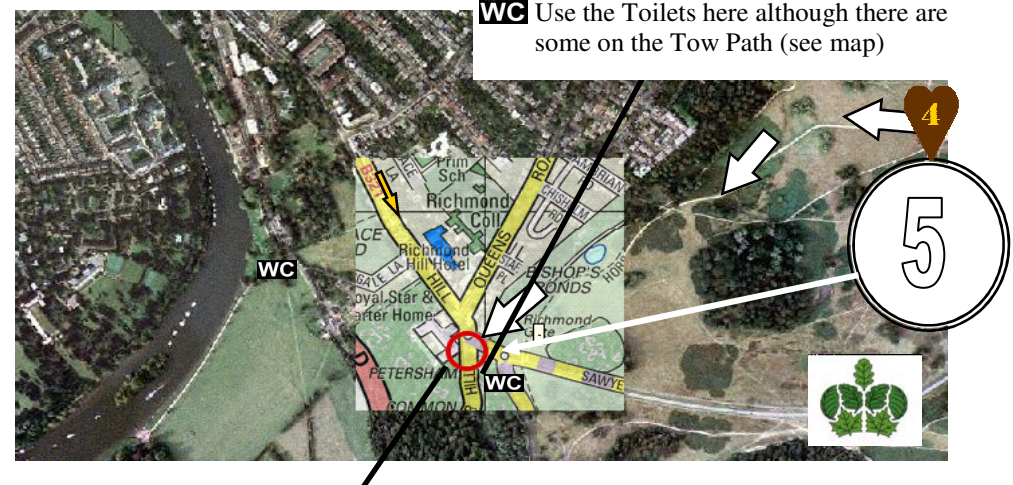
At Small Steps, a teacher, conductor and physiotherapist lead a parent and child team through a structured programme designed to help each child achieve individualised developmental steps.

Within each group session, children work through a series of stimulating and challenging tasks addressing every aspect of a young child's development: physical, social, emotional, communicative and cognitive.

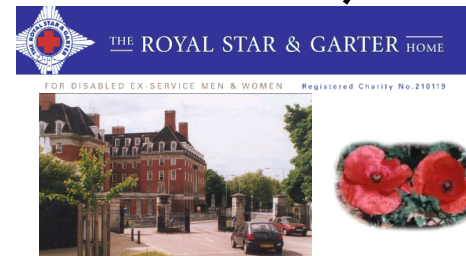
FOURTH STAGE

EAST SHEEN C'MN TO RICHMOND GATE

From East Sheen Common we walk to Bog Gate and back into Richmond Park. Turning right we head onto the Richmond Gate.

THE first donations for artificial poppies were given in Britain on November 11 1921, inspired by John McCrae's 1915 poem 'In Flanders' Fields'.

Some of the bloodiest fighting of World War One took place in the Flanders and Picardy regions of Northern France. The poppy was the only thing which grew in the aftermath of the complete devastation.

Raising money for Small Steps

McCrae, a doctor serving there with the Canadian Armed Forces, wrote these verses in response to his experiences:

*In Flanders' fields the poppies blow
Between the crosses, row, on row,
That mark our place: and in the sky
The larks, still bravely singing, fly
Scarce heard amid tire guns below
We are the dead. Short days ago
We lived, felt dawn, saw sunset glows
Loved and there loved, and now, we lie
In Flanders' fields.
Take rip our quarrel with the foe;
To you from failing hands we throw
The torch be yours to hold it high,
If ye break faith with its who die
We shall not sleep, though poppies grow
In Flanders' fields.*

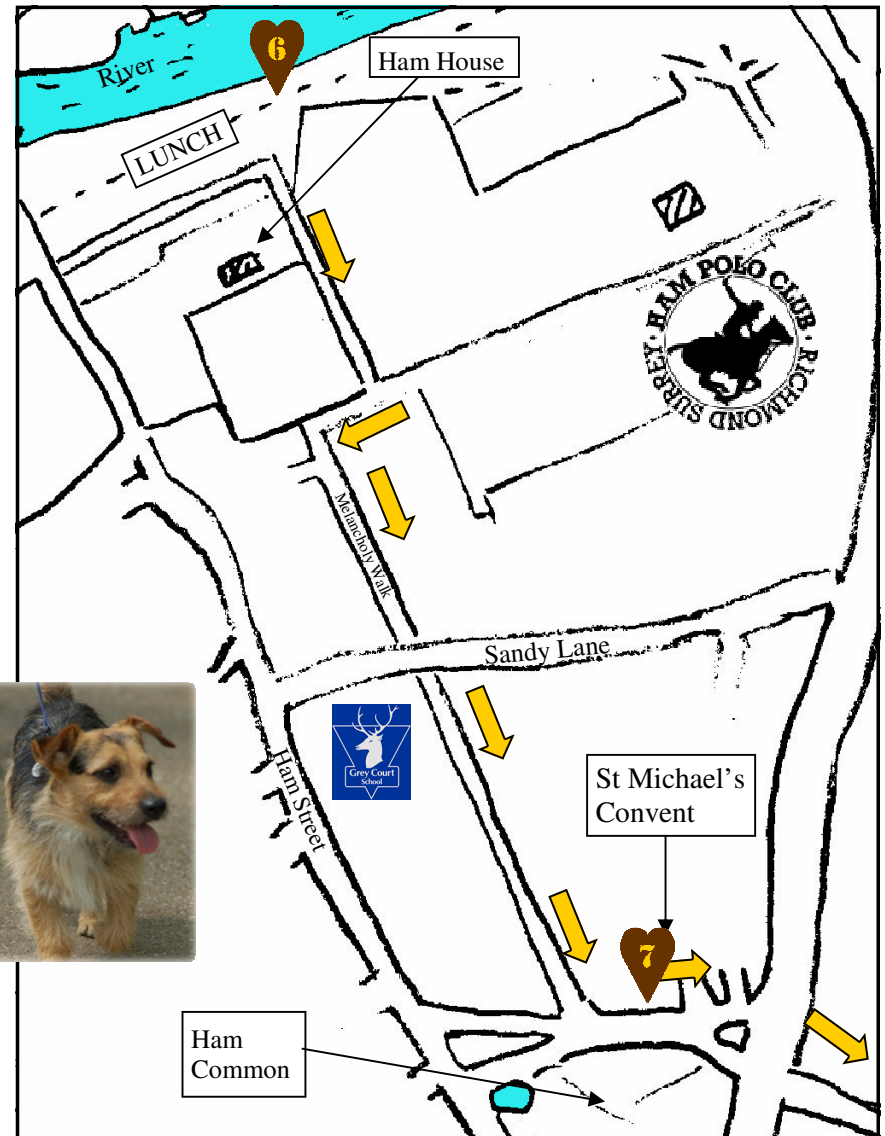
